- Restart Program for grade 7s: 10-week program through McMann during Humanities. Building connections is the preliminary theme. Other topics such as social media, substance use, sleep will be addressed.
- Growth mindset (challenges help me grow) vs. a fixed mindset (failure is the limit of my abilities)
- First month is helping students get organized: they want independence but parents and teachers help set routines and check ins.

- Added Grade 9 Environmental Stewardship CTF Course: fun hands-on science; it replaces one of the 4 options
