




CBE Schools' Waste Assessment

What do we know about CBE Schools' waste reduction programs?

- ~90% of schools participate in the recycling program.
- Over 34,000 kg of waste and recyclables are collected every day.
- ~92% of schools participate in the composting program.





CBE Waste Assessment

What is a waste assessment?

Provides a snapshot of what and how much is being discarded, as well as how it is being disposed. It will give us an estimation of how much waste there really is.

Did you know?

- ► The CBE's overall waste goal is to reduce waste going to the landfill by 80% by 2020 (from 2007/08 levels).
- Over 27,000 kg of <u>recyclables only</u> are collected every month!
- ► Schools that have active organics programs are able to reduce their total waste going to the landfill by **79%.** Paper towel in washrooms and lunchroom areas are a great first step for many schools to start sorting organic waste.





SJAM Waste Audit



What is a waste audit?

It can identify what types of recyclable materials and waste your school facility produces and how much of each is recovered for recycling or thrown in the garbage.

Who else could do an audit for SJAM?

- The school board can hire CBE auditors.
- Also, we can work together to help our school reduce waste by doing individual audits of what is going into the garbages that should not.

Waste bins throughout school.	 Ordered the various bins and went through the school and sorted through waste/recycling. 	The bins should be put up soon. We have them, but we are currently putting them together.	We'll have the bins fully set up and people can/will use them properly and take pride in keeping SJAM green!
